

2010 REGION A CUP RULES

GENERAL

For the seasonal year 2009 - 2010 FYSA Region A is offering competition in each of the following categories:

- Girls and Boys (mixed): Under 11, 12, 13, 14,15,16,17, and 19.
- Festivals will be offered for Under 9 and Under 10 Girls and Boys, in two divisions competitive and recreational.

There will be three (3) Divisions of play in Boys and Girls.

- Division I
- Division II
- Division III

Since the winner of Division I in U11 through U19 represents the Region in President's Cup, if only one team enters this competition in any of these age groups, that team will automatically advance to the President's Cup.

Region Cup Entry deadline is December 16, 2009.

Division I Regional Cup Champions who do not fulfill their obligation to compete in the President's Cup event is subject to a fine of \$2,500 should the opening not be filled by another qualified team from the Region A.

Champions of FYSA President's Cup in ages U13 thru U17 will advance to the Region III President's Cup Champions. Champions of the Region III President's Cup will advance to the National Director's Cup competition.

Also since Both Finalist in Division II in the U-11 to U17 groups will represent Region A in the Division II Cup against teams from Region C, teams that do not fulfill their obligation to compete in the Division II Cup event will be subject to a \$500.00 fine should the opening not be filled by another qualified team from Region A.

It is the responsibility of each team registered and participating in Region A Cup to verify game dates, times and locations through the utilization of the Region A Cup official web site. The Region A Cup Committee will not be responsible for notifications beyond the posting of the original schedule on the official Region A Cup web site.

Following the date the Region A Cup competition schedule has been approved and posted, there will be no schedule changes for any reason.

The Region A Cup Committee is aware that some of these dates may interfere with SAT and or ACT testing, however, the Committee may not have a choice because of field availability. In this instance we ask that players schedule tests on other dates.

DIVISION I

This Division is for A teams that are not playing in State Cup. The winners of this Division will advance to President's Cup. The Regional Cup Committee will determine additional teams to advance if necessary. Winners of President's Cup will advance to USYS Region III President Cup. Winners of Region III President cup will advance to Nationals Directors cup. **If a team is currently playing Division "1" or "A" in league play then the team must register and play in Division I. If the team was in the finals of Division II last year, then the team must play in Division I this year.** The team may also request placement in lower Division II. This request must be faxed to the Region A Cup Vice President to expedite the review and must also accompany and be noted on the application. The communication must present evidence to support this request. Examples of what is required are team roster during league play, results of all matches, league standings, tournaments together with names and phone numbers of all coaches that team has played against during the immediately prior seasonal year. **If request is granted the teams roster must remain exactly the same as it was during league play.**

DIVISION II

This Division is for "B" teams that are not playing in State Cup. If a team is currently playing Division "2" or "B" in league play then the team may register and play in this Division. **If the team was in the finals of Division II last year, then the team may not play in this Division without permission.** A team may also request placement in lower Division III. This request must be faxed to the Region A Cup Vice President to expedite the review and must also accompany and be noted on the application. The communication must present evidence to support this request. Examples of what is required are team roster during league play, results of all matches, league standings, tournaments together with names and phone numbers of all coaches that team has played against during the current seasonal year. **If request is granted the teams roster must remain exactly the same as it was during league play.**

DIVISION III

This Division is for Recreational teams only. Information must be provided with the application that the team can be classified as a recreational team under USSF/USYS guidelines.

ROUND ROBIN PLAY FOR ALL DIVISIONS

The breakdown of all age and gender divisions will be determined by the Region A Cup Committee based on the number of team entries on the due date specified on the application form. This Round Robin competition applies only to ages U11 and above. Round Robin rules do not apply to any Festival competition which includes age divisions of U9 and U10.

Team entries in age and gender divisions of 1 to 20 teams, will be allocated into groups and competition as follows:

16	4 groups of 4	1 st in each group to semifinals
18	3 groups of 4, 2 groups of 3 with cross over game	5 group winners and 3 best second overall to quarter finals
20	5 groups of 4	5 group winners and 3 best overall to quarter finals

In groups of more than 20 the teams registered will be allocated in groups of three (3) or four (4) teams to best serve the overall competition for this first round of competition. In groups where this cannot be met teams will be placed on a waiting list.

GAME PROCEDURE/TEAM CHECK IN

Be at your game site at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled game time in order to take care of pre-game check-in with the site director.

- First team listed is the home team.
- **For Division 1, 2, & 3 a State generated roster plus player passes must be submitted to the site director 30 minutes PRIOR to the game time.**
- **Each team must provide a copy of its roster for each game.**
- **NO EVENT ROSTERS WILL BE ACCEPTED, NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- **NO PASS NO PLAY NO EXCEPTIONS – ALL DIVISIONS.**
- The referee fee shall be paid to the site director.
- The site director will transfer the game roster, player passes and the fees for the game to the referee.
- The site director will determine the location of teams and fans. (it is recommended that teams and fans be on opposite sides of the field.)
- Home Team is to change jerseys if Referee deems a conflict. All teams must play in their primary colors first unless a conflict exists. These are the colors listed on the team's application.
- Game report as completed by the referee is the official document of the game.
- Please leave area clean.
- Remember: You are the representative of your club and hopefully will play and act accordingly.
- **Each team (WINNER AND LOSER) is responsible for reporting to the site director immediately after the game to verify your score and to pick up your passes. Results will be posted as quickly as possible. You are responsible for being at the right place at the right time.**
- **At the end of the game the referee will turn the player passes, rosters and the game report to the site director. The coach of the team may then pick up the passes from the site director.**
- **It shall be the sole responsibility of the coach to verify the game results after each match and to pick up his or her team's player passes.**
- **Any discrepancy not reported to the site director by the end of the day of competition would stand as reported on the game report.**
- Results of all round competition and standings will be posted on the Region A Cup official web site. Results will be available for the public immediately after they are posted.

DETERMINATION OF WINNERS

The following procedure will be used to determine team ranking at the end of the first round of play and the determinations of best seconds:

- 3 Points for Win
- 0 points for Loss
- 1 point for Tie

If rankings are tied, the following procedure will be used until the winner is determined:

1. Winner of Head-to-Head Competition
2. Goals against with a maximum of 4 goals per game.
3. Adjusted Goal differential (Goals for – Goals allowed) max of 4.
4. Goals for with the maximum of 4 goals per game.
5. **Red Card points.**
6. Kicks from the mark as defined by FIFA.

Note1: In cases where goal differential is used, maximum number of goals considered shall be four (4) goals. (i.e.; score of 2-4 differential = 2, score of 7-1 differential = 4)

Note2: In the event that 3 teams are tied for one position after the first five (5) tiebreakers have been used. The following procedure shall be used:

- There will be a blind draw by the site director.
- The first team drawn will sit out with the other two teams participating in kicks from the mark.
- The winner will then play (kicks from the mark) the team sitting out for the chance to advance.
- If two teams advance from this group then the loser of the first set (kicks from the mark) will play (kicks from the mark) against the loser of the second set (kicks from the mark) for second in the group.

PLAYER/COACH'S PASSES

ALL DIVISIONS - NO PASS NO PLAY NO EXCEPTION

Division I & II teams must have verified USYS passes no other passes will be accepted. Each pass must have a picture attached, signed by the player/coach and his/her Club Registrar.

Each player must be registered to the team code entered on the entry form and be LAMINATED.

NO UNVERIFIED PASSES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

PLAYER REQUIREMENTS

Region A Cup players may only play with their primary team. (1ST team listed on their player pass).

No guest players.

Teams are limited to an 18 player roster, **U-16 to U-19** could have 22 players register but only 18 can dress up for a game, which must be declared before each game.

Players may only participate on 1 (one) regional cup team as per FYSA Rule 209.7

Players may not transfer from Region Cup team as long as the team's roster is frozen.

All coaches or team personnel must be on the computer generated roster also.

No coach or team personnel could be on the sidelines, **maximum of three**, unless he/she is listed on the roster.

REFEREE FEES

Referee fees will be split between the two teams and paid prior to each game to the site director in cash, and remember that the site directors **DO NOT HAVE CHANGE so you must bring the correct amount which is as follow for each team and each game:**

EXTERNAL CONDITIONS WEATHER, ETC.

In the event unusual conditions necessitate rescheduling, curtailment, or cancellation of games, the tournament committee shall have absolute authority to make these changes to best serve the interest of the tournament, keeping in mind the need to successfully identify winners by a certain time period.

DECORUM

Coaches are responsible for the decorum of the sidelines and their players at all games. Coaches and other team officials shall be subject to all rules pertaining to misconduct contained herein, including cautions, ejections, and standard suspension. Any other individual, who may be reasonably construed, as being associated with a team such as relatives and spectators, shall also be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of this tournament. Any coach or team official shall be held responsible for the actions of any individual(s) at any match that in the opinion of the referee is a supporter of that team.

EJECTIONS

If a player/coach is ejected from any game, the player/coach's pass together with the referee's report of the incident shall be turned over to the site director by the referee. The site director shall contact the Regional Cup Discipline chairperson about the incident.

The minimum penalty for any ejection is the player/coach shall not be permitted to participate in the next immediate Regional Cup match of his/her team.

**(FYSA minimums as defined under FYSA Rules Section 500 shall apply.)
The Disciplinary Committee of Region A may increase this penalty based on the severity of the incident as contained in the referee's report.**

After the determination of the suspension is made, the site director will be notified informing him of the length of the suspension.

The pass will be returned to the coach. Except for referee assault or abuse. If a coach is registered to two or more teams, the coach shall be suspended for all Cup activity until the original suspension is served with the team with which he/she received the ejection.

When a player is ejected the player shall remain on the bench under the control of the coach. The player shall remove his player's jersey so as to indicate that the player is no longer allowed to participate in the match. The coach shall be held responsible for the actions and conduct of all ejected players.

When a coach is ejected, the coach shall immediately leave the site.

The match may not be restarted until the coach has removed himself.

If this does not occur in a reasonable amount of time, the Laws of the Game apply as to the termination of the game and reporting of this incident. The site director may also request the referee to declare the match terminated and the site director will report this incident to the Regional Vice President. **The coach will not be allowed to return to the site, nor any other site, until the suspension has been served in its entirety.** In the event the team does not have another properly registered and rostered coach at the site, the site director will terminate the match and report as above to the Regional Vice President.

The Regional Cup Committee shall determine the status of the game and its decision shall be binding on all parties.

RED CARD POINTS

For every player that receives an ejection the player's team will receive **ONE (1)** red card point. For every coach that receives an ejection the coach's team(s) will receive **THREE (3)** red card points. **All Red Cards for Major Violent Conduct and Foul/Abusive language directed, shall carry three (3) points**

If a team receives a total of **SIX (6)** red card points during cup competition, the team shall be disqualified from further regional cup competition.

DISCIPLINE

In the event that a team or teams are involved in an extracurricular activity such as bench clearing brawl, etc. both teams may be subject to disqualification from the remainder of the Regional Cup tournament. The extent of this penalty will be at the determination of the Regional Cup Committee. The decision of the cup committee shall be final and binding on all parties.

GAME BALLS

Each team shall furnish game balls at each game, and the final decision should be up to the referee as to which ball will be used.

GRACE PERIODS

Teams not ready to play at the scheduled start time of the first match of the day may be granted a fifteen (15) minute grace period. All games that follow will be started at the assigned time.

For all divisions the minimum number of players is seven (7) for 11 a side teams, six (6) for 8 a side teams and five (5) for festival. Any team not ready to play after this grace period has expired should be reported to the site Director by the referee.

The game will be recorded as a forfeit and the score will be recorded as 4-0.

For further explanation, in the round robin portion of the competition and all Festival games, the score at the end of regulation time will stand. In the quarterfinal, semifinal and final competition of all age groups except Festivals, if there is a tie score at the end of regulation time, the overtime periods as above apply. If at the end of the overtime periods there is still a tie, the game results shall be determined by the taking of kicks from the mark in accordance with FIFA.

Any match, in which the goal differential is six (6) and has completed the 1st half of play, will be declared completed at that point.

No match can be concluded under this rule prior to the ending of the 1st half of play. At any time in the 2nd half the goal differential reaches six (6) the match will be declared completed.

SEMIFINAL PLAY

In Divisions with 4 groups	Win Grp A v Win Grp B, Win Grp C v Win Grp D
In Divisions with 3 groups	Win Grp A v Win Grp B, Win Grp C v 2 nd Best (2 nd Best is not from Grp C. If it is, then A v C and B v 2 nd Best)

PERFORMANCE BOND/FINES

If a team/club has incurred a fine, this team/club must pay this fine to the site director prior to check in for their next game. If the team is no longer in competition the team/club will be billed by the Regional Vice President.

A team withdrawing or not completing their cup schedule will incur the following fines:

Team withdraws after December 22nd but prior to the schedule being completed – loss of entry fee.

Team withdraws after the schedule has been completed and posted – loss of entry fee, plus \$300.00 fine.

Club/Team miss enters team in the competition, i.e. either the wrong team code/division and requires rescheduling \$500.00 fine

Team is disqualified from competition due to disciplinary actions or red card points, \$750.00 fine plus loss of entry fee.

Team forfeit of game - \$200.00 fine plus referee fees for both teams for each game they forfeit.

Team withdrawing from competition before completion of tournament schedule, \$750.00 fine plus loss of entry fee.

RULES OF PLAY

Except as otherwise provided herein, the rules of the Florida Youth Soccer Association, the United States Youth Soccer Association and the FIFA "Laws of the Game" shall apply.

SUBSTITUTIONS

Substitutions shall be unlimited. Substitutions may be made, with the consent of the referee, at the following times:

Prior to a throw-in in your favor.

Prior to a goal kick by either team.

After a goal by either team.

During the water breaks.

After an injury by either team when the referee stops play. (NOTE: **ANY PLAYER ATTENDED TO ON THE FIELD, MUST LEAVE THE FIELD OF PLAY. THIS INCLUDES THE GOALKEEPER**)

At half time

PLAYER EQUIPMENT

The referee is the sole judge of allowed player equipment as prescribed in the Laws of the Game.

ROSTER

Rosters for Divisions I, II and III will be frozen **February 17, 2010**.

Each team is required to have a copy of their roster at each game.

FYSA Official State rosters will be used for all Divisions.

Team coaches and team managers must be aware that this deadline is considered at the FYSA State Office so a Permanent USYSA pass may be prepared.

NO EVENT ROSTERS WILL BE ACCEPTED. NO EXCEPTIONS.

ENTRY FORM RULES

All special rules outlined on the entry form apply to all competitions.

All entry forms must be received, by the deadline indicated on the form, with payment, in order to be considered for Region A Cup play.

PROTESTS

All questions relating to the qualifications of the competitors or interpretation of the rules, or any dispute, shall be referred to the Regional Vice President. The Vice President shall then refer it to the appropriate committee. The decisions of such committee shall be binding on all parties.

To be valid and eligible for consideration, each protest:

A. Must be verbally lodged with the referee, with the site director, and the opposing coach at the game site, and must be noted on the official game report by the referee and site director before leaving the game site.

B. Must be filed with the Regional Vice President within 48 hrs from the schedule time of the game as published in the official Region A web site, and include:

A NON REFUNDABLE FEE, in the amount of \$400.00

This fee may be in cash, cashier's check, club check, or money order made payable to FYSA Region A.

No personal checks shall be accepted.

Seven (7) written copies of the protest, which must include full particulars of the grounds on which the protest is lodged.

Seven (7) written copies of any information to be presented by witnesses. Any protest relating to the grounds, goal post, bars or other appurtenances of the game shall not be entertained.

A plea of ignorance to the rules and regulations of the competition is not sufficient grounds for appeals or protests.

Judgment decisions of the referee are not subject to appeal or protest.

The Regional Vice President shall immediately upon receipt of a protest notify the team against which such protest is made and shall send a copy of the protest and all particulars to that team, which will then have the right to defend its case, with or without witnesses.

The accused team will have 48 hrs to answer to the Regional VP as to the accusations.

The Regional VP will have 48 hrs to get with the Regional Committee and render a decision. The decision of the Regional Committee will be final as it pertains to the competition.
