

How To Obtain A Coaching Course

(Effective as of June 1, 2008)

The philosophy of FYSA is to provide coaching courses designed to instruct candidates in coaching and teaching methods which are appropriate, economical and efficient. Courses are hosted by affiliate members of FYSA where they are located.

The following coaching courses are offered by FYSA:

Parent/Player Clinic	2 hours
Youth Modules U6/8, U8/10 or U10/12	6 hours
F Certificate	8 hours
E Certificate	18 hours
D License	36 hours

Brief Description of courses

Parent/Player Clinic (PPC): clinic including players and a parent-coach education unit that focuses on age specific training. These clinics may be custom designed and are held up to two hours.

Youth modules: age specific training with appropriate activities for youth players for U6/8, U8/10 or U10/12 levels. Generally they are held on a Saturday or Sunday. Sometimes they are held over two evenings in three hour segments.

F Certificate: The entry level course to 11 a side soccer. This is the prerequisite course for the E certificate course and may be held in one day or split over two days.

E Certificate: preparatory course for the D license course for coaches of players 13 and older. The E certificate is a prerequisite for the D course. Generally E courses are held over a Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

D License: highest state license course for coaches of players 13 and up. Coaches are tested in the D course by written and practical field exams. Coaches who pass receive either a "D License" or "D License with recommendation to attend National Coaching School". Generally a D course is held over two Friday, Saturday and Sunday combinations.

D courses require a minimum of two instructors. As such, scheduling requires an application at least three months prior to the date of the course.

E Waiver Policy

There is a requirement of an F certificate before a coach may take an E course. The FYSA Director of Coaching may waive this requirement only if the candidate has two years of Division I college playing experience or higher AND two years of coaching experience of players U14 or higher. A coaching resume must be approved before the candidate may take the course.

Attendance Policy

In order to earn a license, a coach must attend the entire course and pass the exams. In the event a coach misses part of a course, it is the responsibility of that coach to attend the missed segment at another course in order to attain a license.

The Instructional Staff is drawn from our State Staff. No coaches outside the FYSA staff may instruct a licensing course.

The Steps to Obtain a Coaching Course:

1. Check to see if another course has been scheduled in your area at <http://www.fysa.com/coaching/77796.html>. If no course has been scheduled, mail the "Request for Coaching Course" form with three potential dates and the appropriate deposit. Course requests for the Parent/Player Clinic, Modules, F course and E course should be submitted at least **three weeks** in advance. See the requirement for D courses below in section 3. Approval of requests will be affected by the availability of instructors. A confirmation will be sent to the local course coordinator and the course will be posted on the FYSA website.
2. Obtain a facility for the course. A full size field (age appropriate), goals, net, water and soccer balls (suggest each participant bring their own ball and water) are needed. A classroom type setting with a blackboard, chalk, desk or tables and chairs.
3. The D course will require a course request at least **three months** prior to the course. Unlike the other courses, coaches will register directly for D course with the FYSA office. FYSA will update the local course coordinator about the registration count. There will be at least two instructors assigned to each D course and the minimum number of coaches will be 24. Two weeks prior to the course FYSA will determine if there is a sufficient number coaches registered to hold the course or if it needs to be rescheduled or cancelled. FYSA will approve D courses based on availability of qualified instructors and proximity of other D courses to avoid courses being cancelled due to low numbers.
4. The Youth Modules require age specific players at times that need to be set up with instructor. This is a requirement of the course. Failure to do so make negate the ability for the coaches to obtain their certification for the course.
5. A local site coordinator whose duties will include:
 - Notify the State Director of Educational Services **ten days in advance** if the class is to be rescheduled or cancelled. Failure to do so will result in a fine to the host/club or league. Courses cancelled within 24 hours of starting will result in forfeiture of the full deposit.
 - Work with Director of Educational Services in setting times of the course.

- Notify Director of Educational Services ten days prior of the approximate number of candidates so that the proper amount of materials are sent to the course.
 - Make sure all applications/medical releases are signed by candidates as well as the course roster.
 - Coordination as to the usage needs at the facility.
 - Mailing of additional fees to the State office at the conclusion of the course.
6. The assignment of an instructor will be arranged through the Director of Educational Services. If you have an instructor you would like to request include that on your request form.
