Annual General Meeting Rules

- 1. The current version of "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised" shall be the parliamentary authority for conducting the Annual General Meeting unless as described below.
- Identification badges issued by the credentials committee shall be worn for admission to all meetings and events. Badges may not be transferred without proper action by the credentials committee.
- 3. The agenda shall be followed in order unless the body agrees to suspend or postpone an agenda item by majority vote.
- 4. The President may relinquish the chair to a specific person. Should the President be unable to attend the meeting, he/she shall appoint the Vice President of Player and Coaching Development to conduct the meeting in his/her absence.
- 5. All bylaws amendments noticed in accordance with the FYSA Bylaws shall be deemed to have been moved and seconded to the extent otherwise required for their consideration.
- 6. All proposed bylaws amendments shall be deemed to be on the consent calendar. When the Bylaws Committee report is presented, following any introductory remarks by its reporting member, the reporting member shall call up the consent calendar. The presiding officer shall then announce that any delegate may demand separate consideration of any bylaws amendment or amendments on the consent calendar, and shall thereafter allow no less than 30 seconds for delegates to seek recognition to demand such separate consideration and the consent calendar shall not be further considered while any delegate is seeking recognition for that purpose. The bylaws amendments remaining on the consent calendar after any such demands shall then be considered for adoption in gross without debate or amendment. Thereafter any bylaws amendments originally on the consent calendar whose separate consideration was demanded shall be taken up for consideration under the regular rules in the order.
- 7. AGM delegates and FYSA Board Members wishing to speak shall line up at the floor microphones. Upon being recognized, AGM delegates and FYSA Board Members shall give his or her name and office, title, or league.
- 8. AGM delegates and FYSA Board Members are required to follow rules of decorum in debate especially as it relates to confining remarks to the pending item of business, avoiding the use of other delegates' or board members' names, and not carrying on discussion directly with another AGM delegate or FYSA Board Member.
- 9. Motions must be properly made, clearly stated, accurately recorded, seconded if required, debated if allowed, and voted upon according to the parliamentary authority. The chair may not make or second a motion and can only vote on a motion in order to break a tie.
- 10. Voting on motions shall be conducted by the chair (except items 4 and 5 below) and by using one (1) or more of the following methods:
- A. General acclamation
- B. Voice vote
- C. Show of Hands
- D. Roll Call





- E. Secret Ballot
- F. Electronic Voting
- 11. Debate shall be limited to one speech of not more than two (2) minutes for each AGM delegate and/or FYSA Board Member on each debatable motion or bylaw amendment. Allowed time is not transferable or cumulative.
- 12. Members will only be recognized up to two times of each times on any debatable motion
- 13. An amendment to strike out one word or a set of words in multiple places and to insert a different word or a set of words in all of those places shall be in order and shall be deemed to include appropriate modifications in capitalization, number (singular or plural), and case (possessive).
- 14. The secretary or bylaws committee chairman will be authorized to correct article and section designations, punctuation, and cross- references, and to make such other technical and conforming changes as may be necessary to reflect the intent of the membership in connection with the proposed amendments to the bylaws, rules, regulations and policies adopted at the AGM.
- 15. Electronic keypad voting shall be authorized for all business conducted during this meeting except incidental main motions, uncontested elections, or otherwise as ordered by the president or assembly. Voting by electronic keypad devices shall be deemed to be a Division of the Assembly.
- 16. Cell phones and pagers shall be silenced during all meetings.
- 17. Elections Process:
 - A. All candidates must be nominated from the floor regardless of prior nomination (FYSA Rule 5008.6)
 - B. Nominations will require a second, but the person seconding the nomination shall not provide a speech. (FYSA Rule 5008.7)
 - C. The nominator may have 1 minute to speak about the candidate (FYSA Rule 5008.7)
 - D. Each candidate will have 5 minutes to speak; order determined by last name, alphabetically (FYSA Rule 5008.8)
 - E. If there are more than two candidates, we will follow the following procedure:
 - 1. A candidate must receive a majority vote to be elected
 - 2. If no candidate receives the majority on the first ballot, a second round will be required
 - 3. Candidates, nominators, or members will not be allowed to publicly address the membership between rounds of voting
 - 4. Candidates will have the option to withdraw following each round of voting
 - 5. No candidate will be forced to withdraw

Another season has come to a close as we gather at the AGM to reflect on this past seasonal year and look to work together to shape the future.

It's been another busy year for our amazing staff and board of directors. We are proud to announce that we finished the 2022/2023 seasonal year with over 110,000 registered players, a number we have not reached for several years.

In a time of need, we awarded nearly \$80,000.00 in Hurricane Relief helping affiliates who were affected by the storm to open their fields again so the kids could get back to playing soccer. FYSA also awarded nearly \$60,000 in scholarships and over \$90,000 through the FYSA Bucks program.

Other highlights include renewing long term partnerships with the Tampa Bay Rowdies, Orlando City SC and once again hosting the USYS National Championships.

Looking ahead to 2023/2024, a fee increase will take effect that will help properly fund our wonderful TOPSoccer program and provide funding for grassroots initiatives such as coaching education and other initiatives to help grow and strengthen the game where it's needed the most.

Even though we have many positives to celebrate (and we should) we can't ignore that we also find ourselves in very challenging times. With more competing governing bodies in our state we are seeing more leagues and tournaments than ever before. In my opinion, in order for FYSA to remain relevant in today's youth soccer landscape we need a real plan for systemic change that would include for example, a bylaw rewrite and re-evaluating our league and tournament offerings. It is time to reimagine FYSA so that the organization may continue to remain strong and continue to be there for the kids and affiliates for years to come.

I want My most sincere thanks to "FYSA" and all the organization's members that facilitate "The Social Contract" with "State of Florida Youth" to provide for their physical and health wellbeing, enjoyment, skill development, competitive spirit, and professional career opportunities from the game of soccer.

After arriving in the Jacksonville area in 1960 and no opportunity to play soccer, it took a number of years before FYSA was founded and independent teams able to connect as the Organization reached us across the North Florida area. Over the next 7 decades, I was able to coach and help develop countless number of children as I volunteered with great Clubs across the State. Last August, I was fortunate to have been elected to my position as Commissioner and now able to give back direct support to the organization and its many projects.

Activities to Date:

- Had a very busy 2022-2023 Fall-Spring season coaching and helping administer Academy teams at ACSC and to help support gaps in staff and to provide input to try-outs, training, recruitment, and expansion ideas for under-represented areas of our rural areas across the region.
- Was able to work with several Clubs to facilitate communication, relationship building, and overall cooperation and direction as needed.
- Provided support to several families in the area of Coaching, Refereeing, and college
- planning thru showcase events. Continue to be a mentor to family and players seeking scholarships and a way to continue their education.
- Worked thru Christina Unkel and Eddie Loyola to bring closure to a family conflict with the referee certification process of an under-age applicant seeking a license. Brought to light the great effort behind bringing to the State the ability to lower the required referee age for in house Recreation Level games. Coming to FYSA in the Fall 2023. Thank you, Christina & Eddy!!
- Have had a few conversations with Jen Ditillio about TOPSOCCER and providing a training session for the Ancient City Club in order to approach the St. Augustine School for the Deaf and Blind, as well as, many children and adults with disabilities in the area. Tentatively to deliver in the Fall.
- One idea to plan, manage, and deliver a program is to include one of the club's older high school age competitive team members to act as buddies for the participant guests.
- Many thanks to Felipe Munoz, Christian Velasquez, Chris Whittaker, the Referee Crew, and volunteers of the Commissioners Cup qualifiers at Florida Prime Fields in St Johns, Florida.



- We completed in 2 days some 50 games during a horrific wind and rain storm that lasted throughout. Felipe had to close some fields and Christian was on line helping realign the schedule and assignments. The Coaches, Parents, players along with referees were incredibly understanding while we flipped around starting time, field assignments, and referee resources so as to complete the competition in the limited time and space we had to play!! It makes you proud of the job everyone does to produce these events for our state youth and their families.
- On a more sobering note; "15 million children's households cannot afford nutritious food in our country as of the last study in 2015". The FDA thus created a program called CEP, Community Eligibility Provision, to make accessible breakfast and lunch at school to the student body. The CEP schools typically qualify if they have at least 40% low-income family households. CEP School data report that children of low-income households that participate in the nutrition program show "Improved Attendance, higher level achievement, and improved in-school behavior" ... But those children are still at risk when they go home to an unsupervised environment.
- I am collaborating with ACSC, the St. Johns County School System, and the Parks and Recreation dept., to work with an Elementary school (Webster Elementary) to provide a "Pilot" after-school soccer training and education program, free of charge, for school grades k, 1st thru 3rd graders...with 4th and 5th graders program still in the planning process. The long-term plan will be a takeoff on the Pilot. There is ample evidence of the effect of this type of program on low-income household children. This program, we believe, will also feed able families to club soccer and impact the normal growth and expansion of the club. Funding is to come from multiple sources.

Many of the cases we handle are very time sensitive, some requiring a review within a day or two of the information being provided to us. I want to thank the FYSA staff for their assistance in enabling the cases to be addressed without delay.

Should anyone have any questions regarding the manner in which hearings and other administrative matters should be handled in accordance with FYSA Rules and Bylaws, I encourage you to reach out to the Committee as we are anxious to assist when needed.

Members of Florida Youth Soccer Association:

I am pleased to present my report for the FYSA 2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM). Summarizing the achievements and milestones of our association over the past year is no easy task, and I am so proud of the many accomplishments of our board, staff and membership.

Growth

This year, FYSA experienced remarkable growth and engagement within our soccer community. In the 2022/2023 seasonal year, we registered over 113,000 players! This marks the second-highest number of registrants in our 49-year history. This accomplishment reflects the tireless efforts put forth by our dedicated members, coaches, and volunteers who make FYSA a leader in the South Region.

Membership Support

FYSA has been able to provide significant financial assistance to our membership in 2022/2023. We provided \$80,000 in hurricane relief funds to aid our members in their recovery efforts. Additionally, over \$100,000 in team travel stipends were distributed to offset the cost of teams participating in regional and/or national competitions. We are also proud to have awarded \$90,000 in FYSA bucks, which clubs use to enhance their recreational programing. Furthermore, \$60,000 in player scholarships were awarded to support deserving young athletes. In total, over \$330,000 was awarded to our membership during this seasonal year!

USYS Championships

It is with great pleasure that I congratulate six outstanding teams from Florida who were crowned champions at the 2023 Southern Regional Championships and earned the privilege of representing our state at the USYS National Championships.

Olympic Development Program

Any ODP update from 2022/2023 must start with our latest in a long line of amazing individual accomplishments. Florida ODP participants Alyssa Parsons and Sydney Schmidt were BOTH included on the Under 15 US Soccer National Team. This huge accomplishment highlights the tremendous skill of these players and the exceptional programing of Florida ODP.

Last year, 930 players participated in the ODP trials, a testament to the passion and dedication of our young athletes. To streamline the selection process and recognize the talent within our own membership, FYSA pool players were exempt from the tryouts, allowing them to progress directly into the ODP pool.

Among the girls, a total of 91 players made it into the ODP pool, with an impressive 44 players earning a spot on the Region Team. 32% of the girls in the pool who went on to represent the region at higher levels of competition came from our state of Florida!

Similarly, among the boys, 65 players were selected for the ODP pool, and 27 of them secured a place on the Region Team. This translates to an impressive 24% of the boys in the pool who showcased their skills and earned a spot on the regional stage.

The success of our ODP program is a collective effort involving the players, their families, coaches, and the entire FYSA community. We remain committed to providing a nurturing and supportive environment for the continued development of these talented individuals.

2023/2024

Looking ahead to the 2023/2024 seasonal year, FYSA remains committed to giving back to our members. The FYSA Bucks program, player scholarships (grants) and team travel stipends will all be funded in the next fiscal year. These initiatives will continue to support and empower our member clubs and players, fostering the growth of soccer in Florida. We will also utilize the \$1.00 competitive fee increase to further bolster the TOPSoccer program and recreational soccer initiatives.

Moreover, FYSA will continue to lead the region and nation in Risk Management and Safeguarding initiatives through our partnership with Players Health. By prioritizing the well-being and safety of our participants, we aim to create a protected environment for everyone involved in youth soccer.

Ratification of 2023 FYSA Rule Amendments Pursuant to Bylaw 13.2

Rule Ratified: C70 Page: 106

Original:

C70. INSURANCE

C70.1 OBJECTIVES

The Insurance Committee is charged with soliciting bids from agencies that can provide accidental medical and liability coverage for members and participants of FYSA. They must determine FYSA's insurance needs and recommend agent and policy to BOD.

C70.2 STRUCTURE

1. Shall serve for one (1) year until close of business at AGM.

2. Shall be comprised of not less than four (4) members.

C70.3 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Shall establish a bid procedure, coordinate the receiving and dissemination of a minimum of two (2) bids annually and after thorough investigation of those bids, make a recommendation to the BOD.

2. Shall assure all policies include accidental medical and liability coverage for FYSA officers, BOD, RB, players, team staff, affiliates' members, spectators, etc.

3. Shall obtain loss ratios and other pertinent statistics, including a record of claims from the carrier. This information along with submitted bids shall be sent to the BOD by June 1, annually.

- 4. Shall work in close cooperation with the Budget Committee in selecting policy choice.
- 5. Shall meet on an "as needed" basis.
- 6. Develop a budget to cover the projected costs for completion of its task for the seasonal year.
- 7. Shall make such annual and/or interim reports as may be required by the BOD.

C70. INSURANCE

C70.1 OBJECTIVES

7. Shall make such annual and/or interim reports as may be required by the BOD.

Rule Ratified: 5008.2 & 5008.6 Page: 97-98

Original:

5008.2 RC elections shall be held within the Region prior to the AGM and supervised by the RVP or his/her designee. Nominations shall be accepted from the floor even if a slate has been presented by a nominating committee. Eligibility requires the affiliate to be "in good standing" at the time of the election. Election by email shall be permitted under the supervision of the RVP and the FYSA Secretary, who shall approve the procedure.

5008.6 A nominating committee (NC), having been previously approved by the BOD, shall post a notice of all elections, their duties, and the process for nominations on the FYSA website at least 90 days prior to the AGM. The NC will present a slate of candidates for all positions at least 30 days prior to the AGM. The list of candidates shall be given to the affiliates at registration. The NC does not choose the candidates only facilitate an orderly nomination process. The President shall not select the nominating committee. The candidates must be nominated in the same manner from the floor.

Amended:

5008.2 RC elections shall be held within the Region prior to the AGM and supervised by the RVP or his/her designee. Nominations shall be accepted from the floor even if a slate has been presented. Eligibility requires the affiliate to be "in good standing" at the time of the election. Election by email shall be permitted under the supervision of the RVP and the FYSA Secretary, who shall approve the procedure.

5008.6 FYSA shall post a notice of all elections, their duties, and the process for nominations on the FYSA website at least 90 days prior to the AGM. FYSA will present a slate of candidates for all positions at least 30 days prior to the AGM. The list of candidates shall be given to the affiliates at



registration. FYSA does not choose the candidates only facilitate an orderly nomination process. The candidates must be nominated in the same manner from the floor.

Updated rule to match current practices.

Rule Ratified: 502.5 Page: 63

Original:

502.5 FYSA affiliates shall notify the FYSA Office within seven (7) days of any player or coach red card/ejection for violent conduct (major infraction), foul and/or abusive language/gestures directed, spitting, or referee abuse. If the player or coach has two such ejections during a seasonal year or a third within two seasonal years, FYSA will notify the player, coach, affiliate agent of record and reporting affiliate that an additional suspension for thirteen (13) games or six (6) months, whichever is longer be applied to the end of the current suspension. Multiple offenses relating to the same red card/ejection will qualify under this rule. The action may be appealed to the FYSA Protest and Appeals Committee.

Amended:

502.5 FYSA affiliates shall notify the FYSA Office within seven (7) days of any player or coach red card/ejection for violent conduct (major infraction), foul and/or abusive language/gestures directed, spitting, or referee abuse. If the player or coach has two such ejections during a seasonal year or a third within two seasonal years, the matter will be turned over to the FYSA Review and Discipline committee to affirm if additional sanctions should be assessed for a possible additional suspension for thirteen (13) games or six (6) months, whichever is longer. Multiple offenses relating to the same red card/ejection will qualify under this rule. If affirmed by the FYSA Review and Discipline Committee, the action may be appealed to the FYSA Protest and Appeals Committee.

Rationale:

As currently written, 502.5 automatically assesses a six-month (or 13 game) suspension with review only by the FYSA Office. Referee reports are often not detailed enough and/or require interpretation. Adding the Review and Discipline Committee affirmation, aligns with other lengthy suspensions in the rules and will foster more opinions before removing a player or coach for six-months (or 13 games).

The liability that comes with coaches who have not done all risk management requirements may have an impact on insurance premiums for all affiliates. FYSA cannot be lenient on matters of this importance.


