Competition Structure

- Team-based single-tiered league for boys and girls 13U–19U (18/19U combined)
- Up to three regions across Florida
- Top teams from each region advance to the FSPL Playoffs (post-season event)
- 2 automatic promotion spots to National League Sunshine per division

FSPL Regions

- FSPL Central
- FSPL East/West
- FSPL South

Scheduling

- Season-long schedule (Fall & Spring) around FYSA Cups, High School, and major holidays
- Most games played Home/Away with two neutral venue weekends hosted by FYSA when applicable
- FSPL Playoffs on May 9-10, 2026, at Lake Myrtle Sports Park

FSPL PLAYOFFS

More about the FSPL Playoffs:

- Semi-Finals on May 9 (Saturday) and Finals on May 10 (Sunday)
 - Advancement from 3 groups: **Top I team + I Wild Card**
 - Champion and Finalist earn a spot in NL Sunshine
 - Advancement from 2 groups: **Top 2 teams**
 - Champion and Finalist earn a sport in NL Sunshine
 - Advancement from I group: <u>2nd-5th teams</u>
 - Champion will earn promotion to NL Sunshine
 - The Ist-place regular-season team will earn automatic promotion to NL Sunshine and will not participate in the FSPL Playoffs (Similar to the EFL Championship playoff)

SELF-SCHEDULING

- Teams are responsible for inputting kickoff times and venue info for Home games only (Locked matches labeled as "Neutral" or "FYSA-Host" will be scheduled by FYSA)
- Teams are responsible for assigning referees for selfschedule Home games
- All self-schedule Home games must be scheduled at least 14 days before the original date
- Attempt to schedule back-to-back games (retain referees) and have a site director present

SCHEDULING PARAMETERS

- Scheduling parameters will be implemented to avoid teams scheduling matches too early or too late, specifically against opponents that are not within their region.
- Hosting teams must confirm match details at least 2 weeks prior to the match taking place.
- Teams will be required to respond to all requests within 48 hours of the message being sent teams who do not respond within this timeframe are subject to a \$100 fine.
- Hosting Minimum Standards:
 - Provide benches for both teams
 - Ensure fields are safe & properly lined
 - Provide corner flags
 - Anchored goals with the correct size (24ft W x 8ft H)

RESCHEDULE POLICY

- 24/25: I,364 Total League Games
 - 857 Total Reschedule Requests Submitted
- All communication should be done via GotSport Chat
 - Both teams must agree to the change before submitting the change to the league.
 - Ensure your coaches & managers are on your rosters!
- Teams will have until <u>August 29th</u> to submit reschedule requests to the league with no fee.
 - After 8/29, all reschedule requests will require an admin fee assessed to the requesting club.
 - Any requests submitted within 10 days of the scheduled match will require an increased admin fee.
- Teams will have 48 hours to respond to avoid a fine.


PRE-GAME RESPONSIBILITIES

- Home & Away Team Responsibilities:
 - Provide an FSPL Game Report to the referees at least 30 minutes prior to kickoff
 - Present the Player/Coach laminated passes for referee check-in
 - Each team must declare their game day active 18 cross out the players who are not part of that or not in attendance.
 - Provide at least one match ball to the referees.
 - Provide officials with the referee fees (cash on the field):
 - Recommended to provide referees with the <u>Game Day Procedure Document</u>

POST-GAME RESPONSIBILITIES

- Home Team Responsibilities:
 - Scan the QR code on the top right corner of the Game Report to:
 - Input final-score
 - Upload game report
 - Input Red Cards
 - Link for Instructions: https://support.gotsport.com/as-a-coach/manager-how-to-enter/upload-a-score
 - Supplemental Reports & Serving Suspensions:
 - The home team must ensure the referee assignor submits any supplemental reports to FYSA via the Game/Supplemental Report GotSport Form – link below
 - Teams must also submit game reports where players serve suspensions via the same form.

RED CARDS

- Red Cards earned in FSPL must be served in FSPL only.
- If the FSPL season is over and there are still games left to serve, the suspension will be served at the next FYSA-Sanctioned match(es).
- All red cards must be entered on GotSport by the Home Team as part of the Post-Game Procedures.
- Referees must submit a Supplemental Report for Red cards for Violent Conduct, Spitting, or Abusive Language.
- USSF Referee Abuse Prevention (RAP) policy will be followed

US SOCCER RAP POLICY



The Penalties Matrix defines consequences associated with physical and non-physical offenses against Referees.

NON-PHYSICAL OFFENSES of gross misconduct, abuse, and / or assault

NON-PHYSICAL*	MIN. GAMES	TIME
Insulting, Belittling, Insinuating or Taunting Behavior Undermining Referee Authority	2	
Harassment, Intimidation, Retaliation, Abusive, or Threatening (Non Physical) Language	4	
Aggression, Attacking, Derogatory, Cyberbullying, Doxing or Threatening (Physical / Violence) Language	6	6 - 24 Months
Offensive or Discriminatory Act	10	12 - 24 Months

PHYSICAL OFFENSES of gross misconduct, abuse, and / or assault

PHYSICAL*	MIN. GAMES	TIME
Minor or Slight Deliberate Touching	3	1-6 Months
Pushing, Grabbing, Pulling, Squeezing, Pinching, Lightly Slapping, Use of Object in Non Striking Manner, or Physical Property Damage	10	6 - 24 Months
Hitting, Punching, Elbowing, Kicking, Biting, Spiting, Choking, Tackling, Throwing or Use of Object or Any Part of Body (Forearm, Knee, Head) in a Striking Manner		12 Months - Lifetime

KEY PENALTY FACTORS

- Single offenses are at minimum the prescribed game penalty or time penalty for non red zone offenses
- Penalties can be both game and time depending on severity / circumstances
- Second time offenders receive double punishment
- Third time offenders receive a lifetime ban
- More than one offense at the same time is at least the punishment for the most serious offense
- Offenses against minors are automatically subject to a "minor multiplier" resulting in triple punishment
- One offense warning per league to be managed by states and leagues collaboratively
- Game consequences are inclusive of 1 game penalty for any red cards given
- Optionality for 50% penalty for first offense from a minor

ROSTERING

- Max Roster Size: 30 players
- Gameday Roster: 18 players
- Primary and Primary I (Previously known as CP) players only no Secondary/Guest Players
- Up to 13 Primary I Players on the roster
- A player cannot be simultaneously rostered to more than one team in the same gender age group in FSPL
- Players are allowed to Primary I to other teams within the same club in FSPL if none of those teams are in the same gender age group
- Teams must be registered in the 2025-2026 FYSA Registration Event (Roster Source) at least I week before their first game
- Teams will use the "Match Day Roster" to make changes to their roster before each game – instructions below:

PLAYER UNIFORMS

- The referee is the sole judge of allowed player equipment as prescribed by FIFA Laws of the Game.
- Home Team should wear Light colors (Jerseys and Socks)
- Away team should wear Dark colors (Jerseys and Socks)
- In the event of a uniform color conflict, the team causing the conflict will need to change jerseys and socks.



FYSA CUP COMPETITIONS

- Registration for State Cup & Presidents Cup is now open!
 - <u>Highly recommend 18-19U teams to register for State Cup in the Fall!</u> (Teams eliminated by Round of 8 are eligible to play Presidents Cup in the Spring!)

SPECTATOR/TEAM BEHAVIOR

- It will be the responsibility of the coaches to control the behavior of their parents/players.
- Teams who receive ejections due to abusive language, inappropriate spectator behavior or physical violence are subject to fines and removal from the competition.

POINTS OF EMPHASIS

Club to Club Communication

- Clubs must respond to messages/requests within 48 hours
- All communication should go through GotSport Chat

Game Day Procedures & Match Reporting

- Home Team is responsible for reporting scores & RED CARDS
- Home Team is responsible for uploading a photo of the match card on GotSport
- Referee payments remain cash at the field (Each team pays 50% of the total fee)
- Game Day Procedure Document

Protest & Appeals

- Clubs must become familiar with the Protest & Appeals policies within the league
- For any violations, teams will be required to follow these procedures

Referee Abuse Prevention Policy

- RAP Policy
- Increased penalties for non-physical & physical offenses
- All US Soccer sanctioned events & leagues have applied these policies as of March 2025
